RIVER CLEAN UP - A SUCCESS!

OVER 1200 volunteers turn up to clear rubbish



After months of meticulous planning the Rotary Club of Langkawi finally executed our event of the year which was to clear the areas surrounding the Kilim Karst River of rubbish. The Kilim River jetty was shut to tourists for half a day on Saturday 15th March 2014.

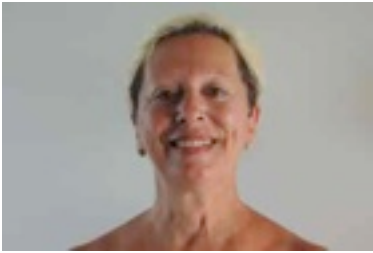
We had the cooperation of the Tourist Boats Association who took over 1200 volunteers in 77 boats to various zones of the river. With hooks, nets and gloves, volunteers picked, dug out, fished out and carried rubbish of all description from the mangrove areas, beaches and the river itself. The rubbish were brought back in large bin bags to land where it was disposed of to its final destination by rubbish trucks managed Environment Idaman.

The overwhelming response from various organisations for example, the Police Academy, Friends of Langkawi Geopark, the tourism academy, Mara Science College, staff from LADA, Lafarge, BMW and Frangipani Hotel, Langkawi Tennis Association and children from secondary schools on the island was an indication that there is an awareness of the importance to keep the island clean and free of rubbish. We cleared over a ton of rubbish ranging from plastic bottles to oil drums.

The event was sponsored by local businesses and individuals living on the island and supported by the local authorities namely the traffic and marine police who made sure the event went safely. LADA provided breakfast and lunch for the volunteers. Tan Sri Khalid Ramli, the CEO of LADA very kindly graced the event by his presence. The volunteers also had T-shirts and certificates of participation.
