Talk on Data Protection

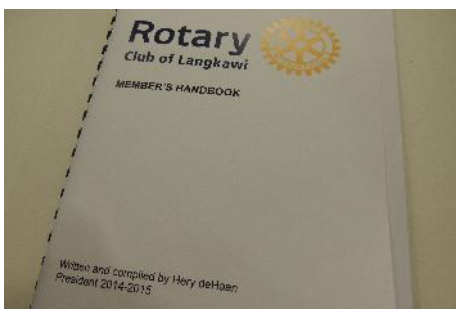

Ever since we adopted SMK Langkawi in Tuba Island we have been visiting the school once a month as per their request. Our regular is Rotarian Julie who has been going there interacting with the children since April. The idea is to expose them to English speaking “outsiders” adding a breath of fresh air to their curriculum. Some critics have questioned if these monthly 2 hour visits would make a difference to the lives of these kids. Our response is that it is a start to something more involved but the progress has to be gradual. These visits are low key and constructive as they provide exposure and stimulation to what is otherwise an isolated community. In the words of the young people, they feel that it’s ‘fun’ and that we’re ‘cool’. The work thus far has been exciting and different. RCL have plans for the school in the coming year.
